Minutes of Senate Meeting at Wintergreen - July 22, 2006

Gerry Roth called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m. A quorum was in attendance.

Anne Johnson made introductions of visitors and guests.

Chris Williamson moved that the agenda be approved. Motion seconded by Peggy McHugh. Motion carried.

Chris Williamson moved to approve the minutes as presented; seconded by Peggy McHugh. Peggy McHugh noted corrections: She is not in charge of MAI hospitality, only registration. Motion carried to approve minutes as corrected.

Chris Williamson moved to accept the Treasurer's report as presented by Donna Yenney; seconded by Anne Johnson. Motion carried.

Vice President's Report

Beth McOsker had nothing new to report and called on the directors for their reports.

Director Reports

Newsletter: Peggy McHugh reported that David Bailey would be taking over the newsletter and that there would be no newsletter prior to Summer Boards. Deadline for newsletter articles is September 1.

B&B Bash: Ariel Jones reported that she talked to Mark Smith about how to make the event better; we need to cut costs. The event will be at the Library of Virginia in late February. Ariel will meet with Mark upon Rod Williams' return from his adoption trip. Ariel Jones has set a target date for sponsors.

Bar: Any special requests, please let Sandy know.

Rooms and Reservations: Peggy McHugh discussed rooms for Boards. Nothing needs to be done for Summer Boards, and she will work with Richmond for the Fall.

Products and Outings: William & Mary game requires a minimum of 20 people to get the group rate. On Oct. 28, we will go to Colonial Downs, which requires a minimum of 15 people and a maximum of 50 to reserve the club suite.

Hospitality: Marla Jones is looking forward to the tailgate event Sept. 23 at the William & Mary game. The tailgate party begins at 4 p.m.; the game begins at 7 p.m. Clark Mabrey has volunteered to make Brunswick stew as the main course. This is an open event; Senators may invite whomever they like. Peggy checked on room availability in the area, and it looked wide open for those dates.

Committee Reports

Audit Committee: Marla Jones discussed the audit committee; everything was in order. Donna Yenney had everything in order for the audit. Recommendation: The committee would like to have future Senate treasurers use the same bookkeeping procedures; it makes it easier and less time-consuming for the audit committee to do their review.

Constitution and By-laws: No report

Finance: Budget for 2006-07 will be presented under new business.

First Timers: No first-timers at this event.

Return the Favor: Ariel Jones reported that we logged 1,300+ hours for Return the Favor. Gerry presented Ariel with the Most Outstanding State award from the USJCI Senate. Gerry passed out trinkets from the USJCI Return the Favor Program Manager to all in attendance.

Good of the Senate: The committee will meet at the Summer Board meeting.

USJCI Foundation Scholarships: Anne Johnson is again in charge of the scholarship awards. The deadline for submission is Dec. 31. She will have Senators in the local area again help with judging. Scholarship winners receive \$1,000.

Nominations and Elections: No report.

Senate Activation and Senate Review: Tommy King discussed Senatorships and mentioned that Charlie Cox had been presented his Senatorship recently at the Camp. Tommy has heard from chapters that are in the process of submitting applications for Senatorships, but he hasn't received any to date. Gerry questioned the status of prospective applications.

MAI 2007: We will host MAI 2007 in Portsmouth, Va., from March 29 -April 1. Volunteers are still needed. Kenny Loyall has volunteered to be in charge of the bar. John Melleky is planning tours. Roz Goin is in charge of the Saturday lunch; the hotel will provide breakfast and dinner on Saturday. There will be light hospitality Thursday, and a hospitality director is needed for the weekend. Chris requested that registration information be sent to the other states for publication in their newsletters.

New Business

Elizabeth Benka moved to accept the budget as proposed; seconded by Tommy King. Discussion followed on the bar, B&B and the newsletter and newsletter costs. Opportunities to increase revenue were discussed. Ariel Jones called for the question; motion seconded by Chris Williamson. Seeing no further discussion, motion was passed.

Upcoming events

Summer Board meeting Aug. 25-27. There will be no Senate meeting.

Jimmy Harris, Maryland JCI Senate President, mentioned that the annual Crabfeed, held at his home, has taken the place of the Maryland tailgate event. He provided us with fliers for the event, which will take place on September 9th.

He reported also that Maryland will be hosting the national convention in Annapolis. There will be a Corps of Corps meeting as well. He mentioned that the seven original Corps members rotated the Corps of Corps meetings.

Larry Richmond provided additional information on Maryland hosting the national convention. There will be pre-registration, pins available for trading and lunch will be served. The event will take place at the Double Tree. There will be a Corps of Corps meeting as well. There will be a luncheon for the 35th anniversary of the JCI Senate; the cost is only \$10.

Announcements

There was discussion and a wrap-up of St. Charles. Anne Johnson said a number of Virginia Senators had attended, including Dan and Elizabeth Benka, Frank and Mary T. Butler and Kit Ford. Anne said there was a grand parade that was quite an event: Virginia Senators wore red and white striped vests and marched down the streets of St. Charles. Award for best booth went to West Virginia. Anne also talked about the Foundation auction. Dan Benka was installed as NVP at the meeting, and Virginia won a program manager award, which was presented to Ariel Jones at the Wintergreen meeting, for Outstanding Return the Favor State. Vickie Dempsey personally praised Ariel Jones for her performance. Frank Butler presented the Donnie Elvis award for most outstanding NVP; Larry Bohn was one of the five finalists.

Sandy Fulgham spoke about camper sponsorships. We should have 100 campers per session for 10 weeks; the last four sessions have spaces, and people are needed to sponsor campers.

Dan reported the JCI Senate Foundation still has cookbooks available for \$15 each. Region III has a new fund-raising chair, Conrad Melkus from W.Va. Senators can join the foundation for \$150 and can do so in \$50 increments. Money spent at the MAI auction is counted toward this fee. Senators are recognized at various levels of giving.

The West Virginia Senate picnic is Aug. 11 and 12. It includes a barbecue, boat races, golfing, etc. Hospitality is \$25 each, \$45 per couple, and rooms are available for \$77/night.

Gerry Roth discussed issues with the website. Bernie Gilbert had been doing the website for years, but it hasn't been kept up to date. Rob Cooke said he would be willing to help.

Jimmy Harris congratulated Dan Benka on his election to NVP, and he presented him with the NVP banner.

Donna Yenney figured out exact costs for the outing. If money is still owed, please see Donna after the meeting. She also will distribute any applicable reimbursements.

Senators talked about what a great time they were having at the outing. Gerry announced that we would leave for the Afton Mountain winery tour after lunch, and she gave directions.

Meeting was adjourned at 12:00 p.m.
